#### SUNDAY THOUGHT

This Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday. This is a day devoted to vocations to the priesthood. Jesus is the Great High Priest (Hebrews 4:14). One of the earliest paintings of Jesus as the Great High Priest was actually as a shepherd, carrying a lamb on his shoulders. This is the image we receive in the Gospel today, 'I am the Good Shepherd.' We also hear about the nature of a Good Shepherd: 'The Good Shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep.' (John 10:11) Priesthood is about service.

However, this service does not mean to serve every person's whim. It's a bit like a parent who doesn't always give their child everything they want, but what they need in order to grow to full maturity. Full maturity is the living out of the Great Commission: 'Go, make disciples of all nations' (Matthew 28:19). Priests and lay people have the same mission. The priest's role as a servant is to 'equip the saints for the work of God.' (Ephesians 4:12). The priest is there to help lay people live out their mission to make disciples of all nations. St. Augustine said, 'For you I am a bishop, with you, I am a Christian'. The second Vatican Council affirmed very emphatically that the priests and baptised have a universal call to holiness and mission.

The priest does not take on the layperson's duty and responsibility to make disciples. Neither does he abdicate his responsibility. These are two extreme forms of clericalism. Instead, the priest should have co-responsibility with parishioners, and actually share his leadership. Incidentally, this is what we do here, with our Leadership Team, which meets weekly to try and guide our parish to be ready for Mission.

We are in a crisis in the Church in the West. Declining numbers of people becoming Catholics, and numbers of young men coming forward to priesthood. Being a Catholic Christian is the most meaningful life one can live. We have such Good News to offer the world: God has defeated sin and death for us! Is that not the best news? We need good young men, with the heart of God the Father, and Jesus the good shepherd, to take on this proper understanding of priesthood: to have co-responsibility and shared leadership for God's mission to make disciples.

We need everyone to take God's call to shared mission to make disciples even more seriously. We need you to encourage young men to think about the priesthood. When was the last time you asked a young, single man 'have you ever thought about the priesthood?' One seed is all it can take.

#### PRAYERS FOR PERSECUTED CHRISTIANS

This month we focus on Persecuted Christians in North Korea. We are fortunate that we are able to practise our faith and follow the teachings of Jesus without fear of persecution. Each month we want to focus your prayers onto those for whom this is not the case. We encourage you to visit the prayer point in each church, take a moment to reflect and read the information on whom the prayer intentions are for.

#### PRIEST TRAINING FUND

This Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday and our second collection will support the Priest Training Fund. This fund pays for the priestly formation of men for the Catholic priesthood. There are currently 49 men studying at Allen Hall seminary, 13 of whom are from our own Diocese. We also have one seminarian in Valladolid and one at the Beda, presently on pastoral placement in Ruislip. There are also two on a propaedeutic year at Redemptoris Mater. Last year 3 deacons were ordained for Westminster Diocese. The Priest Training Fund also supports the ongoing enrichment and formation of our ordained priests. Your gift ensures we can provide training for these men responding to Christ's call to dedicate their lives to serve God's people. Please be as generous as you can.
